Vincent Van Gogh

Vincent Van Gogh was born on 30th March in a little village in the south of the Netherland. He was the eldest child of a clergyman and had three sisters and two brothers. coming from a respectable middle-class family, Vincent learned to love books and drawing. However, he was not a brilliant student at school. Rather, his talent was displayed in art. His parents realized his gift in this area and admired the careful accuracy of his drawings. This was important to young Vincent.

Vincent's interest in paintings was partly influenced by his uncles, three of whom were art dealers. At 16, he started work at Goupil and Company, an important firm of art dealers. Impressed with his work, his company sent him to work in the London gallery. It was in England that he became distressed by the sight of poverty all around him and the enormous gap between the rich and the poor. He decided that he wanted to help the poor and started reading the Bible to become a priest. His work suffered and he was transferred to the main gallery in Paris. Later, he was dismissed for absence without leave. He had also failed to qualify as a priest.

It was not until 1880, at the age of 27, that Vincent decided to become a professional artist. He spent the next five years developing his artistic talent. He had little money and lived in cheap rooms all over the Netherlands. The death of his father in 1885, shattered him. However, he became more determined than ever to be a successful artist.

Throughout his life, Vincent was poor; often hungry and ill. It was his determination to succeed that kept him going until he collapsed in 1890 at the age of 37. His paintings are colorful, bold and passionate, often constructed with painstaking care over several months. Today, he is perhaps the most famous painter in the world. In 1987, his painting of Sunflowers' was sold in London at a high price. He also left behind over 40 self-portraits capturing himself in different moods: cheerful, grim, determined or miserable.

Technology and Children



Technology has completely changed every aspect of our society over the past few years, from the way we work to the way we socialize and everything in between. One of the differences that have been most noticeable is the change in the way that children play and interact with each other. Although technology does provide many positive benefits for learning, it also can have several negative effects on child development and quality of life.

One of the biggest differences in the way that children live today is that they don't get as much exercise as they used to. This is because technology such as computers, smart phones and television encourage them to be ***inactive*** when they get home from school, as opposed to going outside and playing with other kids. Child fatness rates have risen hugely over the past several years.

In addition to not getting enough exercise, many kids do not experience the benefits of spending time outdoors when they are heavily reliant on technology for entertainment purposes. Spending time outdoors has a huge number of positive effects on the body – it provides you with exposure to sunlight, which supplies your body with Vitamin D. Recent research has shown how screens from devices such as tablets and smart phones emit harmful blue light that can cause headaches, eye strain and ***irritated*** eyes for children. Furthermore, sleep is also disturbed by ***harmful*** blue light when children are exposed to screen time in the evening. This makes it increasingly difficult for child's body to effectively prepare to get ready for a goodnight's sleep.

Technology changes the way kids socialize and interact with others, which can have huge impacts on their mental and emotional well-being. It has now become common knowledge that high levels of social media use in both kids and adults can lower self-esteem and create negative moods. This makes it more difficult for them to develop meaningful relationships with others.

This isn't to say that all technology is bad, or that children should never use technology. Technology provides tons of positive opportunities for learning, entertaining, and socializing, but it should be monitored and used appropriately. Instead of banning technology use altogether, set daily limits for how long children can use technology each day.

Finally, set a good example as a parent. If your kids see you on your phone or computer constantly, they will also want to use technology all the time. Moreover, we have to remember technology is relatively new and long-term studies for the effects to the development of children in the digital age isn't available yet. By putting limits on technology usage, both kids and adults can have peace of mind and get more from the technology that they use.

THE GREAT BARRIER REEF

1. Australia's Great Barrier Reef is one of the world's most outstanding natural wonders. The main part of the Barrier Reef lies some 60 kilometers off the eastern coast of Australia, and it takes 90 minutes by speed boat to reach it.
2. Many cruise companies offer trips to the Reef, and the cost generally includes meals and talks from marine experts as well as snorkeling and scuba diving equipment. For an extra charge, larger tour operators also offer small glass-bottom boats, which provide you with a magnificent glimpse of underwater life without having to get your feet wet. Coral needs plenty of sunlight and grows near the surface, so you may just be satisfied with snorkeling on, or just below, the surface, if you don't want to scuba-dive.
3. If you are not a strong swimmer, take a tour that brings you to a coral island rather than the open sea. There, you can float on the sparkling blue sea and look down on orange and white striped clownfish that swim slowly over the top of the coral.
4. Most of the islands that form the Barrier Reef are covered in rainforest, and many are now national parks. Here you will find colorful butterflies and lizards. Heron Island is particularly well-known for its migrating green turtles, which arrive between November and March and lay their eggs in the sand. They are quite happy to do this even though the beach is very close to human habitation.
5. Finally, 26 of the islands offer accommodation and provide a good alternative to staying on the main land. It means that you are closer to the Reef itself (although it is still a boat journey away), and the islands offer a full range of activities for those wanting to be entertained on land as well as under water.

The **lifestyle** of the future is being tested to the full in Zurich. A young family has spent a year living in a 'smart house', where the latest technology is being put to the test in a fully automated 'Internet home' known as Future life.

While the man of the house rests on a sofa enjoying the built-in massager, his newspaper is projected onto the wall via the Internet. His wife, who is visiting a friend, makes a mobile phone call to the house to order the cooker to start heating up the evening meal.

Ursi Steiner and her husband Daniel were selected from 70 couples to live in the home with their two children. The house looks after them so well it can even check their health by taking **samples** to test every time they use the bathroom and warns them if a trip to the doctor is advisable.

The technology means that they never have to **worry** if they have left the oven on. They just get the house to check. And if shopping seems like too much of a chore, the house can do that too, by making a shopping list sending it to the nearest supermarket.

"lots of things are much simpler in this house than in my old home, with online shopping, for example, I don't just save time but can avoid the **crowds**." Says Ursi.

Security is another advantage. The front door, for example, is opened by a fingerprint system, and the entire house can be monitored, even from a distance, by mobile phone.

Despite all the ultra-modern appliances, Ursi admits she misses one thing about her old home – the open fire.
