Marking Guidelines:

- 1- The answer is fully correct = 2.5 marks
- 2- The answer contains one or two (or even more) wrong letters which produce a similar pronunciation without changing the meaning of the target word = 1.5 mark
Example (1): If the target word is 'September' and one of the students has written 'Septimber' or 'Siptember' or 'Siptimber', he/she shall get 1.5 mark
Example (2): If the target word is 'tent' and one of the students has written 'tant', he/she shall get 1.5 mark
- 3- The answer contains one or two extra-letters which produce a similar pronunciation without changing the meaning of the target word = 1.5 mark
Example: If the target word is 'map' and one of the students has written "mapp", he/she shall get 1.5 mark
- 4- The answer is close to the target word, but it leads to a totally different meaning of the target word = 0
Example (1): If the target word is '1952' and one of the students has written "1925" or "952", he/she shall get 0
- 5- The student has written another completely different word = 0
- 6- The student has written the target word in the wrong space = 0
- 7- The student has written an unreadable word = 0

A	This book is for travelers who have money to spend. Top-quality hotels are listed, as well as excellent restaurants, shops, theatres, and cinemas that stay open until very late at night. Color maps and photographs of Britain's most important city centres make it an attractive and useful publication.
B	If you would like to know more about Britain's history but are tired of museums, this book will take you on a tour of the British countryside, stopping at castles and historical sites. For keen walkers, there are suggested routes, but a car is necessary to reach the start of each one.
C	This author stays away from the main tourist centres, which are well covered in other books. He tells us instead about the many towns and villages which are usually forgotten but are certainly worth visiting. His suggested routes avoiding the noisy motorways give a wonderful opportunity to drive through the beautiful countryside.
D	The author covers the history of a number of important British cities and also provides practical information about each one, including names of inexpensive hotels. The train and bus information may go out of date very quickly, but phone numbers are provided so routes can be checked.
E	This book contains 100 walks through fields and forests in different parts of the country. Every walk starts from a town or city, and some walks can be completed in a day. On other walks, you need to stay somewhere overnight. However, suggestions of inexpensive places to stay on the routes are included, as well as information about where to eat and public transport.
F	This new book gives useful information on galleries and museums. Unusually, it includes not just the main cities but also suggests visiting smaller towns whose museums and art galleries contain valuable collections. At the back, there is useful advice on using public transport to travel around Britain.


