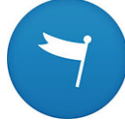

Teacher – Model or two examples using ‘and’, ‘but’, ‘or’ and ‘so’ to remind learners of the meaning of these words. Remind learners of the importance of using correct punctuation, such as full stops and capital letters. Learners – Work individually or in pairs, checking their answers with a partner before checking with the whole class.	Language	5

Teacher – Read through the text slowly, pausing and allowing learners to take in the information. Go through one or two questions with the whole class until they can work alone. Learners – Listen and follow along with the reading, acting out the customs where possible. Work individually to complete the questions, then check with a partner.	Reading	6

Teacher – Explain that learners should focus on the use of ‘and’, ‘but’, and ‘or’ and not worry about words they do not know. If necessary, write one or two examples on the board to guide learners. Learners – Work in pairs or individually to complete their writing. When ready, present to their partner or group.
