

We usually use *anyone* and *anything* with negatives and questions.

everyone is the same as *everybody*

anyone is the same as *anybody*

no-one is the same as *nobody*

Everyone is going to be talking about it at school.

Did *anyone* go to the stadium?

No-one should ever give up.

Everything is brilliant. I've never heard *anything* like it.

Nothing stops these athletes.


