- What jobs can people do in the sea?

1. What jobs can people do in the sea?

- Fisherman – Catches fish to sell or eat.
- Pearl diver – Dives into the sea to find pearls.
- Boat builder – Builds wooden boats (called dhows).
- Sailor – Works on ships that travel across the sea.
- Marine tour guide – Takes people on boat trips to explore islands or sea life.

2. Can you think of any traditional jobs?

- Camel herder – Takes care of camels in the desert.
- Farmer – Grows dates, vegetables, or raises animals.
- Falconer – Trains falcons for hunting or shows.
- Potter – Makes clay pots by hand.
- Weaver – Makes baskets, mats, or tents using palm fronds.
- Blacksmith – Makes tools and weapons from metal.

Meaning of vocabulary:

- **Pearl:** A small, round object made inside oysters, used in jewellery.
- **To dive:** to go deep underwater, usually for swimming or exploring.
- **Divers:** people who go underwater, with special equipment, for work or sport.
- **Sunrise:** the time in the morning when the sun appears.
- **Sunset:** the time in the evening when the sun disappears.
- **Rope:** a thick, strong string made by twisting together many thin strings or fibers, used for tying or pulling things.
- **Tradition:** a custom or way of doing something that has been passed down from generation to generation.

Pearl Diving in the UAE

Pearl diving is a traditional job in the Arabian Gulf. **Pearl diving** season starts in June. Many divers go together in boats to find pearls. There are around 20 people in a boat. They find pearls in animals called **oysters**.

In the past, pearl diving was different. It was a long day. Pearl **divers** worked from **sunrise** to **sunset**. Divers went into the water with a **rope** on their feet. They were underwater for three or four minutes looking for oysters. Then they pulled the rope and went back to the boat. After a short rest, they went back into the water and collected more oysters.

- No, I would not like to be a pearl diver because it seems very difficult and dangerous. Staying underwater for a long time can be scary and tiring.

LANGUAGE TIP

We use the past simple to talk about the past. We add *ed* to the end of a verb to make the regular past simple tense. Irregular verbs are different and we have to learn them.

*In 2010, my cousin **worked** in Fujairah.
I **saw** a pearl diver in the sea last weekend.*

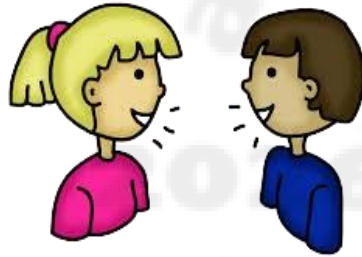
