# Meaning of vocabulary:

- Poem: A piece of writing that uses rhythm, rhyme, and expressive language to share ideas or emotions.
- Poet: A person who writes poems.
- Leader: A person who guides or is in charge of a group.
- To chant: To sing words in a rhythm during a celebration or ceremony.
- Wedding: A ceremony where two people get married.
- Festival: A special event or celebration, often with music, dancing, and food.

- Leader: People who guide or are in charge of a group.
- Wedding: A ceremony where two people get married.
- Festival: A special event or celebration, often with music, dancing, and food.


