Meaning of vocabulary:

- **Poem:** A piece of writing that uses rhythm, rhyme, and expressive language to share ideas or emotions.
- **Poet:** A person who writes poems.
- **Leader:** A person who guides or is in charge of a group.
- **To chant:** To sing words in a rhythm during a celebration or ceremony.
- **Wedding:** A ceremony where two people get married.
- **Festival:** A special event or celebration, often with music, dancing, and food.

- **Leader:** People who guide or are in charge of a group.
- **Wedding:** A ceremony where two people get married.
- **Festival:** A special event or celebration, often with music, dancing, and food.
