Nouns (Possessive 's)

We use 's to show that something belongs to a person or thing.

- Singular: If one person owns it, add 's.
 - Example: My brother's toaster is on the counter.
- Plural: If many people own it and the word ends in s, just add an apostrophe ' .
 - Example: My parents' bedroom is very colorful.

Passives (Present Simple)

We use the passive voice when the action is more important than who is doing it. The formula is: [Object] + is/are + [Past Participle].

- Example: The dishwasher is loaded every night.
- Example: The floors are cleaned by my sister.

Phrasal Verbs (Non-separable)

These are verbs made of two words. In "non-separable" phrasal verbs, the verb and the particle (like on, up, off) must stay together. You cannot put a noun between them.

- Get up: I get up at 7:00 AM.
- Turn on: Please turn on the coffee machine. (Note: While "turn on" can be separable, in many contexts it is treated as a single action unit).



Phrasal Verbs (Three-part)

These consist of a verb + particle + preposition. They are always non-separable.

- Get on with: I get on with my brother very well in the kitchen.
- Catch up with: I need to catch up with my studies in the garden.

Common Three-Part Phrasal Verbs

- Get on with: To have a good relationship with someone.
 - Example: I get on with my brother when we study in the garden.
- Catch up with: To reach the same level as others or meet someone to hear their news.
 - Example: I need to catch up with my homework before I use the microwave.
- Look forward to: To feel excited about something in the future.
 - Example: We look forward to visiting the new hotel next week.
- Run out of: To have none left of something.
 - Example: If we run out of milk, I cannot use the coffee machine.
- Keep up with: To move or progress at the same speed as someone else.
 - Example: It is hard to keep up with the teacher when I am tired.



Grade 8 Term 2 Grammar

- Cut down on: To reduce the amount of something you use or eat.
 - Example: My dad wants to cut down on sugar in his coffee.
- Go through with: To complete an action that is difficult or planned.
 - Example: He decided to go through with tidying the entire balcony.

Quick Grammar Tip

Because these are non-separable, you can never put the object in the middle.

- Correct: I run out of milk.
- Incorrect: I run milk out of.

Adjectives (Comparatives)

Use these to compare two things.

- Short words: Add -er.
 - Example: The garden is brighter than the balcony.
- Long words: Use more.
 - Example: The kitchen is more helpful than the garage.

Conditionals (Zero)

Used for facts or things that are always true. The formula is: If + Present Simple, Present Simple.
