Every year, news channels and websites publish a *prediction* about what type of food people will prefer in restaurants and supermarkets. Recently, a surprising number of people have started paying much more attention to food quality and ingredients. A growing number of people are willing to pay a higher price and a **rate of** premium for meals called *gourmet* food. Gourmet food is not only about the taste.

Many food experts say that the experience is the most important part. For example, there are special cafés inside modern shopping malls, which are located **between** clothing stores and cinema entrances. Other cafés are found **next to** department stores, or even directly **opposite** large electronics shops. However, these places are not always profitable.

Many small food companies now say that e-commerce has become the strongest competition. A customer can simply order organic vegetables and special ingredients online. There are even world famous billionaire investors who invest in e-commerce food delivery apps. Some of these delivery companies are now bigger than supermarket chains.

Traditional shops with high rent and few customers are slowly starting to lose business and sometimes they have to **close down**. Although people still enjoy the taste of fresh food in creative restaurants, the future is moving clearly online.

Plan your time carefully, organise your materials, review your notes every day, and take action early.

When you repeat this system week after week, you become confident, disciplined, and independent. Teachers and employers want students who show strong responsibility and a positive attitude. Follow these simple steps and you will feel more confident in class discussions, and you will be more ready for the level of academic work that university expects.
