○ **Reported Speech: Reported Statements**

Explanation: Reported speech is used to tell someone what another person said, but without using the exact words (direct speech). When changing direct speech to reported speech, we often need to change the tense of verbs and some pronouns.

Rules/changes:

- Present Simple → Past Simple
- Present Continuous → Past Continuous
- Present Perfect → Past Perfect
- Past Simple → Past Perfect
- Will → Would
- Can → Could
- Must → Had to

Examples:

Direct: "I am studying for my exam." → Reported: She said (that) she was studying for her exam.

Direct: "We have finished our project." → Reported: They said (that) they had finished their project.

Direct: "I visited Dubai last year." → Reported: He said (that) he had visited Dubai the previous year.

○ **Conditionals: Third Conditional**

Explanation: The third conditional is used to talk about hypothetical or imaginary situations in the past and their hypothetical results. It expresses regret or speculates about how things could have been different.

Structure: If + past perfect, would/could/might + have + past participle



Examples:

If I had studied harder, I would have passed the exam.

If she had arrived earlier, she could have met the director.

If we had known about the problem, we might have solved it.

○ Past Time: Past Continuous

Explanation: The past continuous tense is used to describe actions that were in progress at a specific time in the past or when another action interrupted them.

Structure: was/were + verb-ing

When to use the Past Continuous:

- For actions in progress at a specific time in the past: "At 7 pm yesterday, I was studying."
- For actions that were interrupted: "I was walking to school when it started to rain."
- For two actions happening simultaneously in the past: "While I was cooking, my sister was setting the table."

When to use the Present Continuous:

- For actions happening right now: "I am studying at the moment."
- For temporary situations: "I am staying with my grandparents this week."
- For future arrangements: "We are meeting the teacher tomorrow."

○ Non-defining Relative Clauses

Explanation

Non-defining relative clauses add extra information to a sentence that is not essential for understanding who or what we're talking about. They are separated from the rest of the sentence by commas.

Relative Pronouns:



- **Who:** for people
- **Which:** for things
- **Whose:** for possession
- **Where:** for places
- **When:** for times

Examples:

- Dubai, which is in the UAE, is known for its modern architecture.
- My teacher, who speaks four languages, has traveled around the world.
- The Burj Khalifa, which was completed in 2010, is the tallest building in the world.

○ Verb Forms with Infinitives and Gerunds

Explanation

Different verbs in English are followed by specific patterns: some verbs are followed by the infinitive (to + verb), some by the gerund (verb + ing), and some can be followed by either.

Verbs followed by to + infinitive:

Want, decide, hope, plan, agree, refuse, need, offer, promise, forget, learn



Verbs followed by verb + ing:

Enjoy, finish, suggest, consider, avoid, practice, mind, miss, risk, imagine, admit

Verbs that can be followed by both (sometimes with a change in meaning):

Like, love, hate, prefer, start, continue, begin, remember, try, stop

Examples:

I enjoy swimming in the sea.

She decided to study medicine.

I like to read books. / I like reading books.

Explanation: Passive modals combine modal verbs (can, could, should, must, might, etc.) with the passive voice structure. They're used to express ability, possibility, obligation, or necessity without focusing on who performs the action.

Structure: Modal + be + past participle

Examples:

The homework must be submitted by Friday. (obligation)

The museum can be visited during weekdays. (possibility)

This form should be completed in blue ink. (recommendation)

The project might be finished by next week. (possibility)
