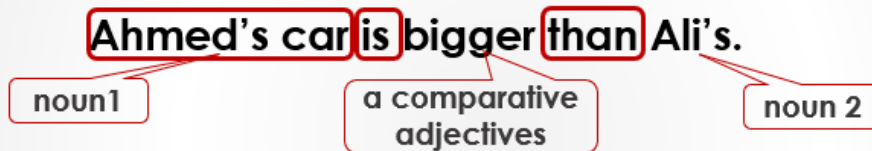

What is a comparative adjective?

An adjective in a comparative form comparing two things.

Making comparative adjectives

1. with regular one syllable adjectives, we add -er to make the comparative form.



small → smaller

2. with adjectives that end with a single vowel followed by a single consonant, the consonant is doubled and -er is added.



big → bigger

Making comparative adjectives

3. with regular one and two syllable adjectives that end in y, we remove the y and add -ier to make the comparative form.



happy → happier

4. With two syllable adjectives, and all three syllable adjectives we add more before the adjective.



beautiful → more beautiful

5. Making comparison between two things are equal in some way.

We use this comparison form → noun1 + is + as adjective as + noun2

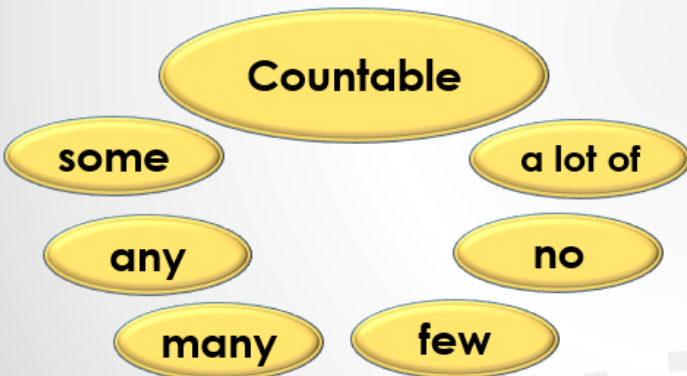
Hamad is as smart as Salman. → both are smart

What are quantifiers?

They are words that usually come before a noun to express the amount or quantity of an object. Some quantifiers go with countable, and others go with uncountable, but there are some that go with both.

quantifiers which go with both:

quantifiers which don't go with both:



Positive sentence: quantifier + countable

We have **a lot of** cherries.



She bought **some** grapes.



Positive sentence: quantifier + uncountable

I drink **a lot of** water everyday.



She needs **some** oil for cooking.



Negative sentence: quantifier + countable

She has **no** bananas in her fridge.



There aren't **any** cookies in the jar.



Negative sentence: quantifier + uncountable

I have **no** juice.



I don't add **any** sugar to my tea.



Unit 7

Making superlative adjectives

To make a superlative adjective word you must change the adjective to the superlative form.

1. with regular one syllable adjectives, we add -est to make the superlative form.

→ tall → tallest

2. with adjectives that end with a single vowel followed by a single consonant, the consonant is doubled and -est is added.

→ big → biggest

Making superlative adjectives

3. with regular one and two syllable adjectives that end in y, we remove the y and add -iest to make the superlative form.

→ lazy → laziest
→ happy → happiest

4. With two syllable adjectives, and all three syllable adjectives we add least or most before the adjective (least is the smallest amount of something while most is the superlative form of much).

→ expensive → least expensive
→ expensive → most expensive
→ beautiful → least beautiful
→ beautiful → most beautiful

Making superlative adjectives

Irregular adjectives

Irregular adjectives don't follow the previous rules.
So, you must memorize them.

good	→	best
bad	→	worst
far	→	furthest
well	→	best

Future Forms

1. The weather **is going to be** foggy in the morning and partly cloudy the rest of day.

subject V to be Infinitive V

2. I **am going to go** walking in the park as I love cloudy weather.

1. Future "going to"

When do we use "future going to"?

We use "be going to" to predict something that we think is certain to happen, or which we have evidence for now e.g. It's cloudy, it is going to rain.

What is the form of "future going to" tense?

subject + verb (to be) + going to + infinitive verb

she/he/it → is + going to

I → am + going to

you → are + going to

plural subject → are + going to

1. The weather **will be** rainy and cloudy.

subject Infinitive V

2. I **will stay** home and watch a film.

Subject Infinitive V

2. Future "will"

When do we use "future will"?

We use "future will" to predict something that we think is uncertain to happen.

What is the form of "future will" tense?

affirmative subject + will + infinitive verb

negative subject + won't + infinitive verb

Examples

1- The Internet usage is going to change (change) a lot in the future.

2- We won't use (not use) the internet to search for what we need.

3- It will recognise (recognise) what we want before we search.

4- All companies are going to study (study) the people's usage of internet.

5- The companies will tell (tell) invent apps and content according to what they think we need.

He/ she/ it + has + past participle v.

I/ they/ you/ they + have + past participle v.

We use since/for with present perfect to show the time.

To express existence at different points of time we use the forms below:

There + Verb 'to be'



1. There + is/ are (present time)
2. There + was/ were (past time)

There is a famous landmark in our area.

present simple

There are beautiful flowers in our garden.

There was a nice show last night.

past simple

There were a lot of people in the exhibition.

3. There + has/ have been (present perfect time)

There have been virtual classes since the pandemic started.

There has been a Bahrain Sports Day since February 2017.

4. There + is/ are going to be (future 'going to' time)

There is going to be a big celebration next week.

There are going to be virtual live concerts in the weekend.

5. There + will be (future 'will' time)

There will be a lot of virtual games on the coming Sports Day.

David Almond

David Almond didn't plan to write books for children. But it was always his ambition to become a writer. As a child, he loved reading. He studied Literature at university. When he finished studying, first he worked in a hotel, then he worked as a builder, and finally he became a primary school teacher. During his time as a teacher, he wrote his first stories. They were for adults. Almond's first novel for young people was *Skellig*. It came out in 1998, after two books of stories for adults. The adult books didn't make him famous. But *Skellig* was very popular. It became a play, an opera and a film. The film appeared in 2009, but didn't become a very big hit. Almond still writes novels and wins prizes. In 2010, he won a very important award, the Hans Christian Anderson Award. This award is for writers who make an important contribution to children's literature. Apart from writing, Almond loves running and football.

Michael Morpurgo

Michael Morpurgo wrote a very famous novel called *War Horse* in 1982. They made a popular film of the story in 2011. But Morpurgo didn't begin his professional life as a writer. When he finished studying English and French at university, he became a teacher in a primary school. One day he began reading out a book to his students, but he didn't like the story. The students didn't like it either. He told his wife about this. His wife suggested he writes his own story. He did, and the children loved it! His first children book appeared in 1974. It was a collection of the stories he told to his students. With his wife, Morpurgo started a charity for children called "Farms for City Children" in 1976.
