Martha: Well, our IT teacher at school taught us all about business logos and websites. It wasn't like I really thought I could help local shops attract to young people or anything. I just decided I wanted to understand how to actually build a website myself.

Interviewer: Your website is very popular! But, how is yours different from all the other ones that compare prices and that sort of thing?

Martha: Well, when you open up my page you just see the logos with all these different companies, shops, cinemas, cafes. It's not just a table with products and lots of prices. That's what all the others are. But just with a different site name at the top.
