C	Chalkface by Glenn Jones This is an account of the day today, routine of a teacher in Wales, and the pressure and difficulties of the teaching environment. Not as dull as it sounds because the writing is so good.
D	A Collection Of Ghost Stories By Woman edited by Sylvia Moon The titles alone- "The Haunted Cupboard", "The Night Nurses Story"- make you want to read on. Nothing too scary, but all the old favourites are here, plus some unusual new ways of hunting people. Very enjoyable.
E	On The Rocks by Andrie Popov What will life be like in 2055? This exciting new novel, set 30 years in the future, shows the world returning to an Ice Age. Relations between countries have cooled as well. Full of fascinating ideas, this book will make you look hard at the way we live now.
F	Home Sweet Home by Marjorie Greene When Claire suddenly finds that she has been given a house, she doesn't care that it's an old ruin in the middle of nowhere. She wants to rebuild it, despite all the troubles it will involve and her 40 year old neighbour. Read how she makes friends and finds true friendship in this enjoyable story.

Enleigh Charity Fun Run

Sunday, 1st August Manor Park, Enleigh

This will be the fifth year of the Enleigh Fun Run.

This year it promises to be bigger and better than ever!

- **How far?**

The Fun Run is five kilometres long and takes place in Manor Park.

- **I can't run 5 kilometres!**

Don't worry! You can run or walk the course. The point is to take part and raise as much money as possible for local charities.

- **Who can enter?**

Anyone can enter the walking event and anyone over 16 can take part in the Run. You can run the race alone or enter as a team, with each member running part of the distance. Why not organise a group of friends or work colleagues to run in a team with you?

- **How do I enter?**

Just fill in the application form and send it off in the envelope provided (no stamp required). You will be sent full details of the event, as well as a number and a sponsor form. Runners are asked to raise at least £40, which will be given to local charities. Alternatively, just turn up before 10am on the day itself, pay the £5 registration fee and collect your Number. All participants should wear their numbers as it helps us to record your time and position in the race.

- **Preparing for the Fun Run**

The earlier you start training for the event the better. Don't worry if you haven't exercised for years, you still have time to build up your fitness. Start by walking at least three times a week for 20 minutes. You can even try to include walking more in your daily routine. For example, walking up stairs rather than using the lift. Gradually increase the speed and distance you walk, then try to increase your speed to a jog. It's much easier to exercise with a partner, so try to persuade a friend to join you. This is also a great way to make sure you don't cheat! You should aim to be able to run three kilometres without feeling out of breath. Remember, always stretch before and after exercise.

- **The day of the Fun Run**

On the day itself you are invited to join local fitness instructor, Carol White, for a warm-up. The Fun Run starts at 12pm and the walk starts at 12:15pm. The course goes around Manor Park, starting at the boating lake and ending by the cricket pitch. When you finish you will be given a medal and a special certificate. During the race water will be provided and there are changing facilities in the cricket hut.
