Number 6: Which place did they decide to go first?

Woman: I was thinking of going to the museum. We can find nice souvenirs there; statues or coins.

Man: Aren't we going there tomorrow?

Woman: You're right. Okay, we can go to the mall.

Man: I want to get my friend something special like a hand-made bracelet or earrings... I'm not sure we can find such things there.

Woman: Let's go to the old market, then. It says here we can find lots of unusual things, even jewellery.
