



Pillows have a long history and many changes, but the idea stays the same: to make sleep more comfortable. The first pillows were not soft cushions. In ancient times, around 7000 BCE, people used hard supports made from stone, wood, or metal. These **stiff** objects kept the head raised and helped with breathing, but they were rough on the skin and neck. In ancient Egypt and China, wooden or ceramic head supports were common. Meanwhile, in other places, people used small bags filled with herbs, straw, or feathers. These early pillows were durable and hard to damage, but not soft.




As time passed, designers began to add fabric covers. By the classical period, around 500 BCE in Greece and Rome, pillows began to appear in wealthier homes, often stuffed with feathers and covered in linen. Such fabric covers kept the filling clean and made the pillow feel nicer to touch. The choice of filling increased. Feathers were popular because they were light and warm. Later, wool, cotton, and similar materials joined the list. Each filling gave a different feel; some were soft, while others were bouncy or supportive.

Pillow shapes also changed. Some were flat, while others were shaped to hold the head or support the neck. Different countries created designs that matched local beds and sleeping habits. Therefore, as materials varied and building skills improved, pillows began to reflect cultural preferences and sleeping styles, blending usage with style.

The idea of comfort helped pillows change as people farmed, traded, and built cities. Well-designed pillows with bright colours became luxurious accessories for the rich families in Europe, while simpler ones remained more practical in Asia. By the 17th century, pillows were almost in every home and for everyone because of the rise of factories, which helped mass produce pillows and make **them** affordable.

Nowadays, pillows come in many shapes and sizes. There are travel pillows, small decorative cushions, and large bed pillows. People benefit from using pillows to help with neck pain, back position, or simply to feel comfortable.
