When we talk about time, there seem to be just two ways of perceiving it: some people complain about never having any, others are always looking for ways to kill time. But time is actually very fairly distributed. Everyone gets 60 minutes per hour and 24 hours per day. Yet, it is only the daily tasks that are distributed unequally. They make the day too short for some people and too long for others.

A schedule can help people fight their way through too many tasks. It shows us how the 168 hours of a week are spent. By means of such a schedule, we can observe critically the aspects we like and the **ones** we don't. Some of the results might even shock us - when we realise, for instance, how much time we spend watching television and how little time remains for the people closest to us. By using the time-schedule techniques, you can improve your ability to function more effectively - even when time is tight and pressures are high,

Often time problems are caused by an external situation. In our work, we usually have no choice but to fix dates and to be on time for appointments. But time problems also have their roots in our fears and desires. Postponing work is another element of time problems. Postponing work occurs when you put off tasks that you should be focusing on right now. When you postpone your work, you feel guilty that you haven't started; you come to fear doing the task; and, eventually, everything catches up with you when you fail to complete the work on time. People insist on controlling or doing all of the work themselves because they can't trust anyone else to do it correctly.

There are so many ways that you can use to improve your time management skills and increase productivity at work. You should **prioritize** your tasks: Before the start of the day, make a list of tasks that need your immediate attention as unimportant tasks can consume much of your precious time. When you have a task at hand, set a realistic deadline and stick to it. Challenge yourself and meet the deadline. Reward yourself for meeting a difficult challenge. Most of the successful men and women have one thing in common. They start their day early as it gives them time to sit, think, and plan their day. When you get up early, you are more calm, creative, and clear-headed. Whenever you find yourself free for 10-15 minutes, take a break. Too much stress can take toll on your body and affect your productivity. Take a walk, listen to some music or do some quick stretches.

Japanese people are known for their intelligence, good manners, and strong health. But what is it about Japan's culture that makes the Japanese so remarkably successful? We believe the answer may lie in Japan's education system.

The basic school system in Japan is composed of elementary school (lasting six years), middle school (three years), high school (three years), and university (four years). Education is compulsory only for the nine years of elementary and middle school, but 98% of students go on to high school. Students usually have to take exams in order to enter high schools and universities. In Japanese schools, students don't take any exams until they reach grade four. There are many goals of the first three years of school in Japan. The primary goal is to develop children's character not to judge their knowledge or learning. Children are also taught to respect other people. Further, **they** are taught to be gentle to animals and nature. In addition, they learn how to be generous, kind, and empathetic.

While most schools and universities in the world begin their academic year in September or October, in Japan it is April that marks the start of the academic and business calendar. The first day of school often coincides with one of the most beautiful natural phenomena; the time of cherry blossom. Japanese children enter the first grade of elementary school when they are six. There are around 30 to 40 students in a typical elementary school class. The subjects they study include Japanese, mathematics, science, social studies, music, crafts, physical education, and home economics (to learn simple cooking and sewing skills). Many elementary schools have started teaching English, too. Information Technology is increasingly being used to enhance education, and most schools have access to the Internet.

You won't find a **janitor** in any Japanese school. Students have to clean the classrooms, cafeterias, and even toilets all by themselves. The Japanese education system believes that requiring students to clean up after themselves teaches them to work in a team and help each other. Besides, spending their own time and effort sweeping, mopping, and wiping makes kids respect their own work and the work of others. In public elementary and junior high schools, all classmates eat in their classroom together with the teacher. Everyone eats the exact same meal, which is prepared by lunch ladies and served by students who take turns dishing out the rice, fish, and soup to their classmates. This helps build positive teacher-student relationships.

There is a famous expression in English: "Stop the world, I want to get off!" This expression refers to a feeling of panic, or stress, that makes a person want to stop whatever they are doing, try to relax, and become calm again. 'Stress' means pressure or tension. It is one of the most common causes of health problems in modern life. Too much stress results in physical, emotional, and mental health problems.

There are **numerous** physical effects of stress. Stress can affect the heart. It can increase the pulse rate, make the heart skip beats, and can cause high blood pressure. Stress can affect the respiratory system in the lungs. It can lead to asthma. It can cause a person to breathe too fast, resulting in a loss of important carbon dioxide. Stress can affect the stomach. **It** can cause stomachaches and problems in digesting food. These are only a few examples of the wide range of illnesses and symptoms resulting from stress.

Emotions are also easily affected by stress. People suffering from stress often feel anxious. They may have panic attacks. They may feel tired at all times. When people are under stress, they often overreact to little problems. For example, a normally gentle parent under a lot of stress at work may yell at a child for dropping a glass of juice. Stress can make people angry, moody, or nervous.

Long-term stress can lead to a variety of serious mental illnesses. Depression, an extreme feeling of sadness and hopelessness, can be the result of continued and increasing stress. Addiction often develops as a result of overuse of drugs to try to relieve stress. Eating disorders, such as anorexia, are sometimes caused or made worse by stress. If stress is allowed to continue, then one's mental health is put at risk.

It is obvious that stress is a serious problem. It attacks the body. It affects the emotions. Untreated, it may eventually result in mental illness. On every working day, they deliver more than 130,000 lunch boxes - all while going through traffic and crowds in the world's third most populated city. They charge between 150 to 300 rupees per each lunch box per month, depending on the location and collection time. The dabbawalas are widely known for their error-free services. Isn't this remarkable!

The dabbawalas are an incredible team. They have professional management. They are always on time, even through the rainiest days on the planet. Their creativity and cleverness have kept them alive. When telephone services were not available for everyone in India, the dabbawalas encouraged mothers to use their system to communicate with their sons by placing little notes inside their lunch boxes. The sons enjoyed the notes as much as the food. The dabbawalas were able to "think outside the box" and widen their abilities despite their simple structure as they mainly depended on using bicycles for transportation. They have also used technology. On March 25, 2006, the dabbawalas went online with www.mydabbawala.com. The dabbawalas have become icons of hard work and dedication. In fact, the 5,000 workers including a number of women are so well-known that King Charles III (Prince Charles at that time) paid them a visit during his trip to India. Around age 11, as she recovered from the flu, her doctor recommended swimming to rebuild her strength. Diving became one of her favourite activities. At that time, many people feared diving as it was too dangerous for women and girls. So, most indoor swimming pools would not let Aileen practise her lovable sport. Aileen decided to find other ways to practice her favourite sport. She joined the U.S Olympic trials. She used an outdoor tide pool; where ocean water gathered between rocks. Female divers dived there. **They** had to wait for the high tide to practise diving. When conditions were perfect, the tide pool was just like a real swimming pool!

At age 14 Aileen qualified for the 1920 U.S Olympic diving and swim team. Thanks to her qualification, she was able to travel around the world. On the 13-day journey to Belgium, Aileen practised swimming in a small swimming pool to be physically prepared for the competitions. Conditions at the Olympic Games were not much better since Belgium was still **recovering** from World War I. The outdoor pools were so muddy, Aileen was afraid that when she dived in, she would get stuck at the bottom forever. During the competition, she overcame her fears and won the gold medal in diving! She became the youngest Olympic gold medalist of her time at age 14.

At the 1924 Olympics in Paris, Aileen again competed in both swimming and diving. She won a silver medal for the 3 metre-springboard event and a bronze medal in the 100 metre-backstroke competition, making her the first person to earn medals in both diving and swimming in the same Olympic year.

However, these days, getting fish from the ocean may be damaging both the ocean and its future. Ocean fishing now is a big business, so fishing companies want to get as much fish as possible from the ocean. However, **their** methods, such as overfishing, fish farming, and bottom searching, are threats to our oceans.

Overfishing is a major threat. It happens when modern, technologically advanced ships hunt for fish. With the equipment on board, these ships can immediately find groups of fish and get them all. In fact, these ships remove fish from the ocean faster than the ocean can replace them. Another problem with overfishing is that the nets catch more than fish; they trap whales, dolphins, and even birds, which are then destroyed.

A fish farm is where large numbers of fish are raised for food. Some people think that fish farming is the answer to overfishing in the ocean. However, fish farming is also damaging the ocean. For example, a typical salmon farm raises thousands of fish. To feed these fish, other, smaller fish are removed from the ocean in huge quantities. In fact, it **requires** five pounds of ocean fish to produce one pound of salmon. It's clear that fish farming is not the answer.

Bottom searching is a term that describes catching fish at the bottom of the ocean. This happens when ships lower huge nets to the bottom of the ocean. The nets have wheels, which destroy everything they run over. The nets take everything, including many poisonous creatures that cannot be eaten. Moreover, the balance of diverse life that lives there is destroyed. Scientists say that there are still many kinds of undiscovered animals that live there. When they are brought to the surface, many are just thrown away.

In conclusion, our oceans provide us with many benefits, one of which is fish. We need to be careful, however, that our desire for fish doesn't destroy the ocean. Big fishing companies must find alternatives to their practices of overfishing, fish farming, and bottom searching in order to avoid destroying the ocean and running out of the fish we desire.

Born with a cleft lip, she is among the fortunate few to be treated at the Kenyatta University Hospital in Nairobi, thanks to the kindness of medical volunteers sent by charity Operation Smile.

Her treatment is free of charge. The charity advertised its visit last January and word spread fast. Charles says: “I’ve been fixing bicycles and doing whatever jobs I can find to come here. My daughter is my Achilles' heel. I want my daughter to wear a self-confident smile. I also like her to be able to speak correctly so she does well at school. I’m **proud** and more than happy to have earned the money to do this for her.”

Operation Smile was created in 1982 to correct facial deformities in children. Since then, the charity has become a global organization and now has 5,000 registered medical and non-medical professional volunteers, deployed in many countries. It has treated more than 100,000 children in 25 countries. Each volunteer commits two weeks of his time and pays £300 to join a project. Cleft lip and palate affect around one in 500 babies. In Britain, infants are treated soon after birth; however, just one in four receive medical assistance in the developing world.

Wanjiru’s surgeon, Ankur Pandya, undertook his first Operation Smile mission a year ago and has completed three more since. His own successful battle with cancer prompted him to help others unable to obtain medical assistance as easily as he had. “I received a lot of medical care and support from friends and colleagues in the medical community. Ever since, I’ve been committed to giving

something back,” he says. “The next time I see Wanjiru and her father, after the operation, tears of joy well up in his eyes.” “My daughter will now have a good future,” he smiles. “She looks completely different. I am looking forward to showing my wife her new smile. She won’t recognise her.” Despite her pain, Wanjiru manages a cheery smile, her first of many.

1. **S**an Francisco Supervisor Fiona Ma was so concerned about kids skipping school to play Internet games that last February she successfully pushed for an ordinance that can make it illegal for anyone under the age of 17 to be in an Internet café during school hours. The cafés that the ordinance focuses on rent computer time by hour to people, usually young teens, who play online video games. It may not be hard to understand why these kids become so hooked. Online video games give the player a chance to escape from bullying, peer pressure and chores for a world where they have total control.

2. **O**nline game addiction has become a worldwide problem. The Chinese government has introduced an "anti-online game addiction system" that warns players after three hours of continuous play that they "have entered unhealthy game time, please go offline immediately to rest. If your health is not damaged, the benefits you can draw will be cut to zero." The gamer would have to stay off for five hours before coming back. Players would be able to resume play where he or she left off. In South Korea, a man died after playing almost 50 straight hours at an Internet café. The 28-year-old man was playing "StarCraft," an interactive video game. He had reportedly just **quit** his job so that he could spend more time playing online.

3. **I**n the same country, a couple was arrested after they had left their 4-month-old daughter unsupervised at home to go play "World of Warcraft" at an Internet café. The child was found dead on her stomach, apparently dying of suffocation. The couple said they only meant to stay a few hours but ended up staying longer than expected.

4. **S**upervisor Ma says while the problem may not be so dramatic in San Francisco, something needed to be done. "A lot of my friends have kids who are all just addicted and just play these games all the time," Ma says. "The people who are doing that are not hurting anyone else.
