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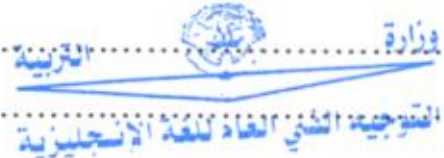

VI. Reading Comprehension (110 Marks)

Read the following passage carefully, then answer the questions that follow:

Food is not only something we eat; it is a window into culture and identity. Every country has dishes that tell a story about its people, history, and way of life. When we try food from another country, we are not only enjoying a meal but also learning about the traditions, family values, and the importance people give to their culture. For many, food is a connection to home, celebrations, and even a symbol of national identity.

Food is strongly connected to geography. The natural environment shapes what people eat. For example, countries near the sea rely on fish and seafood, while those with rich soil grow a wide variety of fruits, grains, and vegetables. Climate also plays a role: in warm areas, spicy food helps people stay cool and fight bacteria. In cold areas, on the other hand, heavy soups and stews provide people with warmth and energy. This shows that food is more than just taste; **it** is linked to survival and the relationship between humans and nature.

Around the world, many dishes may look unusual but are actually delicious. In Italy, *truffle pasta* is prepared with rare mushrooms found underground. The mushrooms may look strange, but their strong **aroma** fills the air and gives the pasta a rich and unforgettable flavour. In Japan, *mochi ice cream* surprises visitors with its chewy rice top layer and creamy filling. It is unusual in texture, but fun to eat and very popular among young people. In South Korea, *kimchi* is a mixture of cabbage and garlic. It is kept for weeks until it becomes ready to eat. It has a sharp smell, but it is refreshing, healthy, and eaten daily with almost every meal as part of their tradition. In Thailand, *mango sticky rice* combines sweet tropical fruit with coconut-flavoured rice, creating a dessert that both locals and tourists can enjoy. In France, *crêpes* are thin pancakes that may be filled with chocolate, fruit, or even cheese, turning a simple-looking dish into something exciting.

These foods show that what first seems “strange” can be tasty and enjoyable. Food is not only about filling the stomach; it is about creativity, tradition, and sharing experiences. Trying new dishes helps us open our minds, discover new flavours, and understand more about different cultures. Perhaps the real adventure in food is not just eating but learning the stories behind each dish and realising how it connects us to the world.
