SIMPLE PAST TENSE

The Simple Past Tense is used to talk about events and actions that happened at a definite time in the past.

E.g.:

I was at home last night.

She got up at ten last Sunday.

They watched a soccer game yesterday.

*** Some signal words of the Simple Past are:
last night / month / week, yesterday, two weeks ago...**

AFFIRMATIVE FORM

Look at the chart.

PERSONAL PRONOUN

VERBS

I	played
YOU	played
HE	played
SHE	played
IT	played
WE	played
YOU	played
THEY	played

SIMPLE PAST TENSE

There are some verbs which are called **REGULAR VERBS.**

All of them end in “ED” in the past form.

E.g.:

WATCH – WATCHED

PLAY – PLAYED

WORK – WORKED

SIMPLE PAST TENSE

* Depending on the verb, it's added "IED".

**Verbs ending in "Y"
preceded by a consonant**

-Y + IED

E.g.

John stud**ied** hard yesterday.

SIMPLE PAST TENSE

• There are other verbs which are called **IRREGULAR VERBS**, because they don't follow any rules. Each one is different from the other.

E.g.

go – went

eat – ate

NOW, YOU!



This is Annie.

This is what she did last weekend:



NOW, YOU!



She walked her dog.

NOW, YOU!



She played soccer.

NOW, YOU!

She rode a bike.



NEGATIVE FORM

Look at the chart.

PERSONAL PRONOUN

AUXILIARY + VERB

I	didn't work
YOU	didn't work
HE	didn't work
SHE	didn't work
IT	didn't work
WE	didn't work
YOU	didn't work
THEY	didn't work

SIMPLE PAST TENSE

In the negative form, it's necessary to use the auxiliary **DIDN'T.**

* When **DIDN'T** is used in the sentence, the verb remains in its base form.

* **DIDN'T** is used with all Personal Pronouns.

• The auxiliary always comes before the verb.

E.g.:

John **didn't have** a pet when he was a kid.

We **didn't watch** TV yesterday.

I **didn't see** my friend at school this morning.

SIMPLE PAST TENSE

- * In the interrogative form, it's necessary to use the auxiliary **DID**.
- * When **DID** is used, the verb remains in its base form.
- * **DID** is used with all Personal Pronouns.
- * The auxiliary always comes before the subject.

E.g.:

Did you meet your cousin yesterday?

What **did** they do on the weekend?

Where **did** she go on her last vacation?

NOW, YOU!

I to music last night.

I to the beach on Saturday.

I hot-dogs for dinner last week.

We a book this morning.



READ – LISTEN – HAVE – GO

NOW, YOU!

I **LISTENED / DIDN'T LISTEN** to music last night.

I **WENT / DIDN'T GO** to the beach on Saturday.

I **HAD / DIDN'T HAVE** hot-dogs for dinner last week.

We **READ / DIDN'T READ** a book this morning.
