

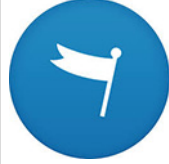

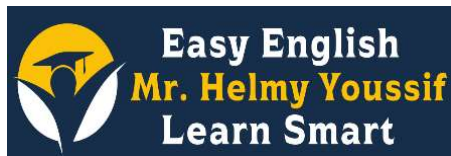

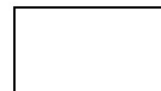

She has supported many charities, She became an ambassador of a charity called “Gingerbread” in 2000, in the same year, she won British Book Award. She wrote in fantasy and crime fiction. She is writing short stories and children books as well. Harry Potter films are a huge success, many people have watched them in the cinema and many people have read the books too.

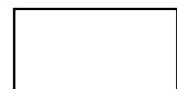

Benjamin Spock was one of American non fiction writers. He was born in 1903, in New Haven. He studied in a private preparatory school and later he went to Phillips Academy. From 1921 to 1925, he attended Yale University and studied English literature. In 1924, he played in the Olympic Games in Paris and won the Olympic gold medal in rowing.

In 1925, he attended the medical school at Yale before moving to 'Columbia University's College of Physicians and Surgeons'. In 1943, while he was on a summer vacation, he started writing his most famous book 'Baby and Child Care'.

From 1944 to 1946, he worked as a medical officer in the navy. At the same time, he continued to work on his book. The book was published in 1946. Over the years, the book was translated into many languages and became one of the all-time best-sellers. In 1968, he was awarded as the 'Humanist of the Year' by the 'American Humanist Association'. He died on March 15, 1998, at his home in La Jolla, California.

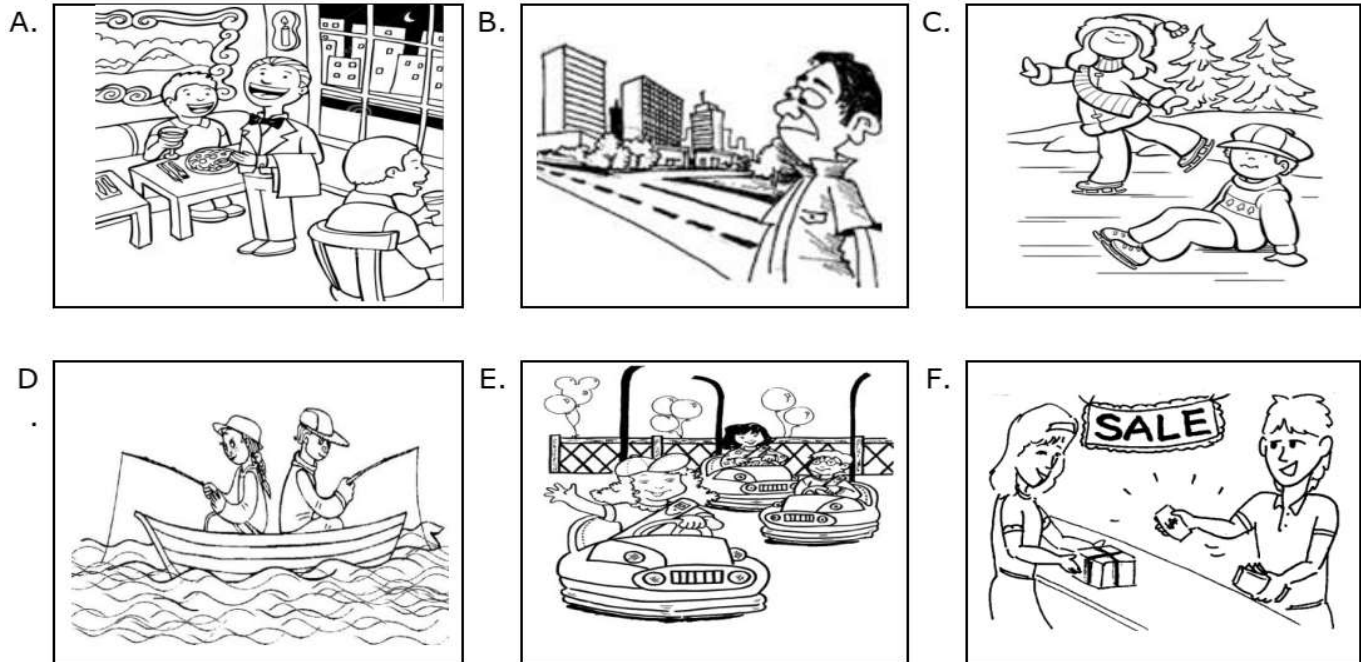

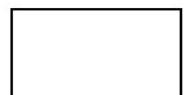

Mark Twain was an American writer. He was born in ١٨٣٥ in the USA. He had ٦ brothers and sisters. When he was ٤ years old, his family moved to a village near the river. A few years later, Mark's father died so he had to find a job. In ١٨٥٧, he worked as a riverboat pilot on the Mississippi River. His salary from this job was very good at that time. Then, because of the war in the USA in ١٨٦١ between people of the North and those of the South, traffic along the river stopped and so Mark lost his job. In search of a new job, Mark travelled west in July of ١٨٦١, with his brother, Orion. They arrived in a new city where Mark found a job in a newspaper. It was a good chance for him to start writing and make people enjoy reading. In ١٨٧٠, Mark Twain married a girl called Olivia and her father's name was Langdon. Their first child was also called Langdon. This name was the same as the father of Mark Twain's wife. We learnt about the life of Mark Twain. It is right that he died in ١٩١٠, but his books remind us of him. He wrote famous stories such as "Adventures of Tom Sawyer" in ١٨٧٦ and "Life on the Mississippi" in ١٨٨٣.

In the beginning, people from different places barter different things for example:

- The Aztecs used small doll figures made of solid gold to buy things.
- The ancient Egyptians used their rings as money. When the time came to pay their bills, they simply pulled off a ring or two to use as payment.
- The Celts in ancient Ireland also used ring money, plus bracelet money. The Celts also liked to wear their wealth.
- The ancient Africans invented knife money.

In other places in the world, people tried to use rice, or bread, or chocolate as money.

About 2,700 years ago, somebody came up with the idea of using metal coins as money. The first coins appeared in ancient Turkey. The coins were round and flat and made of gold and silver. They were small and easy to carry. They could be decorated with pictures and designs. The use of coins made trade simple.

The ancient Chinese invented paper. Once paper was invented, the invention of paper money was predicable there. It was light in weight, and could be colorfully decorated.
