For most children today, school is like a second home. But in the past, schools were very different from today.

In Victorian England,

Classrooms were very big and the windows were usually very high. Students couldn't see outside! One teacher often taught more than 70 children, so teachers were sometimes **cruel**. Paper was very expensive, so most students didn't have notebooks. They wrote on 'slates' with 'slate pencils'. Students learnt the three Rs: Reading, Writing, and Rithmetic (Maths). Once a week they had Geography and History. Girls developed other skills; for example, they learnt to sew.

Today,

Classrooms are big and comfortable and usually they have a lot of windows. Teachers are nice and friendly with children. You can tell them your problems and they can help! All students have got books, notebooks and computers. Most schools have also got libraries and computer rooms. Children learn and do a number of interesting subjects like Science, Art or PE. Therefore, they have a good knowledge of various subjects.
