Scorpions are arachnids and have eight legs like their cousins—spiders, mites, and ticks. They can quickly grab an insect with their pincers and whip their telson, the poisonous tip of their tail, forward and sting their prey. They use their poison to kill prey and to defend against predators.

Scorpions look like small lobsters and may be the first animals to move from water to land hundreds of millions of years ago. They have been around since before the age of the dinosaurs. Fossils of scorpions from Scotland hundreds of millions of years ago show that their appearance hasn't changed over the millennia, but they are now half the size of their ancient ancestors.

Only 30 or 40 species around the world have strong enough poison to kill a person. Each species has a special type of venom that works well against a chosen prey.

Scorpions typically eat insects, but when food is scarce, they can slow their metabolism to as little as one-third the typical rate for arthropods. This technique enables some species to use little oxygen and live on only one insect per year. Such survival skills allow scorpions to live in some of the planet's toughest environments. Researchers have even frozen scorpions overnight, only to put them in the sun the next day and watch them thaw out and walk away. However, they are concealing or hiding animals, so in areas of heavy grasses, where loose soil is not available, scorpions may not be able to survive.

Achraf Hakimi (born November 4, 1998) is a professional footballer who plays mainly as a right-back for Ligue 1 club Paris Saint-Germain. Born in Spain, he plays for the Moroccan national team. He can also play as a left-back and a winger, and is regarded as one of the best defenders in the world.

Hakimi began playing for Real Madrid Castilla in 2016 and was promoted to the first team in 2017. He was sent on a two-year loan deal to Bundesliga side Borussia Dortmund, winning the DFL-Supercup in 2019. He then signed with Serie A side Inter Milan for a reported fee of €40 million, helping the club win the 2020–21 Serie A title, their first in 11 years. Paris Saint-Germain then signed him in 2021 for a reported fee of €60 million.

Born in Spain to parents from Morocco, Hakimi was capped by Morocco at the under-20 level before making his senior international debut in 2016, aged 17. He was chosen in Morocco's squads for the FIFA World Cup in 2018 and 2022, and the Africa Cup of Nations in 2019 and 2021.

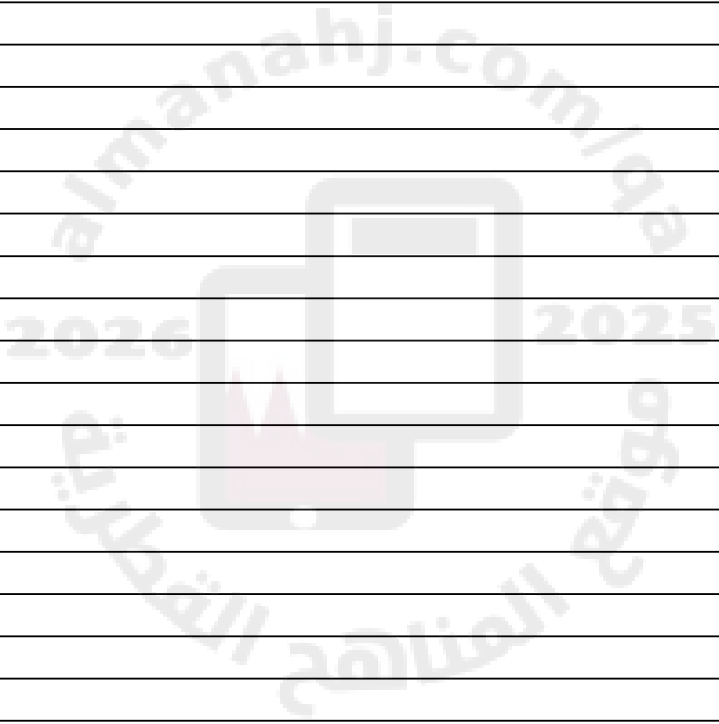
