Most of these immigrants were able to get just enough money to pay for the trip across the ocean by boat. Many arrived without any money to their names. Men, women, and children stayed in crowded and smelly compartments, deep down in the hold of the ship. They had no showers, and there were no dining rooms for them. Ellis Island became known as "Heartbreak Island" among immigrants.

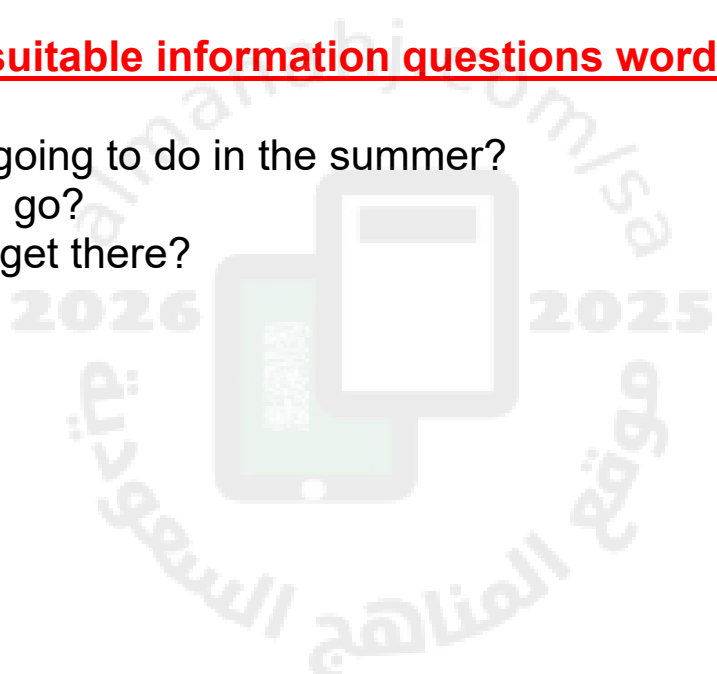
