Additional Activity

In pairs, have students write 5 to 10 incorrect statements about the information on pages 18 and 19. For example: ***Great white sharks can grow up to ten meters long.*** Then have students switch partners and ask their new partner to correct the statements. For example: ***No, they can't. They can grow up to six meters long.***



- No one knows exactly how long great white sharks live. Most biologists estimate 30 to 40 years; however, some claim that they can live to 100 years.
- The biggest great white shark ever found was 7 meters (23 feet) long in the Mediterranean Sea.
- Great whites can poke their heads out of the water, and jump out of the water as well.
