Conditional Sentences with Present, Future, and past Forms:

Two clauses: If + cause + result

Present facts:

If you cook an egg in the microwave, it explodes.

The egg explodes if you cook it in the microwave.

Future facts:

If Saeed gets the job, he will be very happy.

If their team wins, the fans are going to be

Saeed will be very happy if he gets the job.

The fans are going to be happy if their team

May / Might:

"to suggest something is possible, but not certain"

If Noura doesn't study, she might fail the test.

Would:

"to talk about imaginary or hypothetical situations"

page: 123

If people took the bus more often, there would be less traffic.

I'd Rather

I'd Rather = (I would rather) → to talk about preferences.

I'd rather live in the country than live in the city.

Wish page: 123

Wish + simple past → for things you want to happen in the present but probably won't.

Faisal wishes he was/were rich

They wish they had more time

Verb + infinitive

afford, choose, decide, expect, forget, hope, learn, manage, offer, promise, refuse, remember, try

Inf. = to + V. "in the base form" → she **tried** to **sleep** on the plane, but she couldn't

Gerunds as subjects

gerund = V.ing → "noun"

Tipping is not common in Japan.

Verb + Noun/Object Pronoun + infinitive

In China, people don't **expect** you **to tip**.

Past Perfect



had + P.P.

→ to indicate an action that happened before another action in the past.

By the time we got to the airport, our flight had already left

After she had gone to the hotel, Amal exchanged some money. (she'd)

I had never eaten sushi before I traveled to Japan. (I'd)
