Earth Day is an event that occurs each year on April 22nd. It is a celebration of Earth and a time to inspire and educate people on how to take care of the environment. In 1970, a United States senator named Gaylord Nelson wanted to help people learn how to protect the environment. He wrote articles for magazines and letters to schools across the country telling them about his ideas. On April 22nd, 1970, 20



million people joined in rallies, marches, and educational programs, celebrating the first Earth Day. The same year, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) was created. It is a part of the government that does research and makes laws to help protect people and the environment. The idea of taking care of the environment has spread all over the world, and now more than 190 countries celebrate the Earth Day each year. Earth Day is a great time to remind ourselves how important is to take care of our Earth and protect the environment but to really love our we must remember to treat every day like the Earth Day.

We can keep Earth clean by following the rule of "reduce, reuse, recycle". **Reduce** means use less. We can reduce our use of resources like water or gasoline, electricity. **Reuse** means use again, rather than throw things away. We can reuse many things like jars and boxes. **Recycle** means to make new things from something old. We can keep Earth clean by recycling materials such as aluminum, plastic and paper.

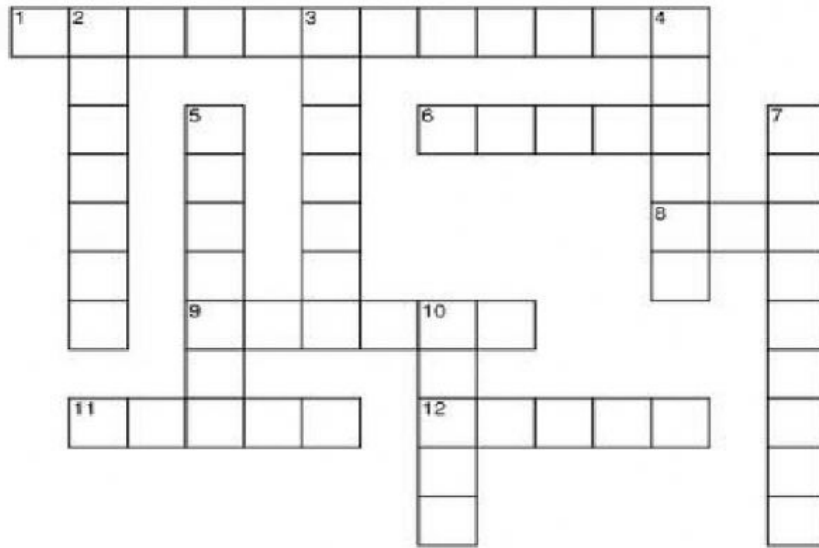
